Vanraj Bhatia is one of India's leading composers of art and film music. Trained in traditional Indian raga and Western composition (with Nadia Boulanger), his music combines the two with precisely notated rhythms and ornaments. This challenging four movement contemporary work for solo flute (Night Music I,

Song from Jammu, Dance in 3+7 rhythm, Night Music II) utilizes elements of the Indian folk flute music played by boys in the night markets of Delhi.

Piobaireachd John Purser

Scottish composer John Purser's virtuoso Piobaireachd (2005) for the modern flute is based on an ancient Scottish musical form, developed from the Highland bagpipe, Celtic harp, Gaelic song, and later imitated on the transverse flute. A piobaireachd (pronounced: pee-ba-roch) is a slow theme with increasingly demanding variations, with the slow theme returning at the end. Performed by Alexa Still at the 2006 Conventions of the NFA and British Flute Society.

Gamal Abdel-Rahim The Lotus Pond (Bohayrat Al-Lotus)

Known as the "Bartok of Egypt," Abdel-Rahim's music contains beautiful ornamented solo lines and exotic non-Western harmonies based on Arabic modes (maqamat). Amy Beach Sonata in A Minor

Amy Marcy Cheney Beach was one of the most gifted composers of her day, the first prominent American woman composer of symphonic music. The Sonata in A Minor, Op. 34, (1896) is an epic romantic piece in the style of Brahms and Chopin. Originally for violin, this transcription for flute and piano by Dr. Alexa Still is similar in stature and difficulty to the Cesar Franck Sonata. Technically easier than the Prokofiev Sonata, it requires similar endurance due to

Paquito D'Rivera Vals Venezolano and Contradanza

D'Rivera is well known as a cross-over artist and composer. These two exciting Latin dance pieces work well with or without the piano accompaniments. Contradanza is a tribute to legendary Cuban composer Ernesto Lecuona; the Vals Venezolano honors Venezuela's Antonio Lauro in a lively syncopated waltz. These vibrant pieces are perfect as encores or instrumental feature pieces! (See bio, page 5)

Alexa Still's arrangement of two movements from the Suite for Violin is a wonderful addition to the solo flute repertoire. Mother and Child is lyrical and expressive, employing the singing qualities of all of the flute's ranges and is reminiscent of both spirituals and Debussy. (Umoja is the Swahili word for "unity" and is the first day in the African-American celebration of Kwanzaa). 

# ADOLPHUS HAILSTORK



Adolphus Hailstork's compositions have been described as a crossover hybrid of African-American and European-American Music. He received his doctorate in composition from Michigan State University following studies at the Manhattan School of Music under Vittorio Giannini and David Diamond, at the American Institute at Fontainebleau with Nadia Boulanger, and at Howard University.

Dr. Hailstork has written numerous works for chorus, solo voice, various chamber ensembles, band, and orchestra. Three of his largest and most frequently performed choral

works are the triptych Songs of Isaiah, the oratorio Done Made My Vow, and the cantata I Will Lift Up Mine Eyes.

In 1990 a consortium of five orchestras commissioned a Piano Concerto. Dr. Hailstork was commissioned to write Festival Music for the Baltimore Symphony and his other compositions have been performed by the Philadelphia Orchestra, Chicago Symphony and New York Philharmonic, led by conductors Daniel Barenboim, James DePriest, and Kurt Masur.

### ANDREA CLEARFIELD Andrea Clearfield's compositions for

instrumental and vocal soloists, mixed chamber ensembles, dance, orchestra, and chorus feature colorful lyricism and dance-like rhythms. They have been performed internationally and premiered by such noted artists as Carol Wincenc, Edgar Meyer, Frøydis Ree Wekre and James Buswell at venues including Merkin Hall and the Sarasota, Norfolk, Banff and Aspen Music Festivals.



In 1996 she was the winner of the Nancy Van de Vate Prize for Orchestral Music, awarded by The International Alliance for Women in Music "Search for New Music" for On the Pulse of Morning, a cantata for chorus, soloists and orchestra to poetry by Maya Angelou. Dr. Clearfield has also received awards from ASCAP, The Leeway Foundation, the American Music Center, the American Composers Forum and the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts. Her hour-long oratorio Woman of Valor was premiered by the Los Angeles Jewish Symphony in April, 2000, and portions of the work were aired nationally on NPR's "All Things Considered".

A native of Philadelphia, she received a D.M.A. in Composition from Temple University and a M.M. in Piano Performance from the University of the Arts. She serves on the Composition faculty at the University of the Arts and the Associate Piano faculty at the Sarasota Music Festival.

As a pianist, she has performed and recorded with numerous soloists and ensembles in styles ranging from classical and world music to rock and free improvisation, and has performed with the Court of the Dalai Lama. A strong believer in creating community through music, Dr. Clearfield is also the host, producer and founder of the Philadelphia SALON Concert Series featuring contemporary, classical, jazz, electronic and world music since 1986.

# ĐÔ HÔNG QUÂN

Do Hong Quan was born in 1956 into a family of musical traditions. His father, Mr. Do Nhuan, was a famous musician and composer of Vietnam and the former General Secretary of the Association of Vietnamese Musicians.

Do Hong Quan began his studies on piano at the age of 6 at the Vietnam National Conservatory and completed the 11 year piano course. In 1976

he was sent to study composition and conducting at the Moscow State Conservatory in Russia and graduated with honors in 1981 (Red Diploma). In 1991 and 1992 he studied composition and conducting at the Paris National Conservatory.

Beginning his professional career in Hanoi in 1986, Do Hong Quan has served as Head of the Department of the Vietnam Opera-Ballet Theatre, Vice-Director of the Hanoi Youth Theatre, Conductor of the Hanoi Conservatory Symphonic Orchestras, and is currently the Dean of the Composition Faculty at the Hanoi Conservatory.

His most well known works are Variations for Piano, Four Pictures for Oboe (or Flute), Piano and Percussion, Rhapsodie Vietnam for Grand Symphonic Orchestra, Concerto for Violin and Orchestra, and the ballet The Mists, which won the State Musical Prize. ### PAQUITO D'RIVERA

One of the most well known cross-over artists in the music field today, Paquito D'Rivera was born in Havana, Cuba, and began his career as a child prodigy, playing both the clarinet and saxophone with the Cuban National Symphony Orchestra. He became one of the founding members of the Orquesta Cubana de Musica Moderna, and was also a founding member and co-director of the innovative musical group Irakere, which toured extensively throughout America and Europe and won a Grammy for its explosive mix of jazz, rock, classical and traditional Cuban music.

In May 2003, D'Rivera was awarded an Honorary Doctorate of Music Degree from the Berklee College of Music, adding to his numerous awards including a Lifetime Achievement Award for his Contribution to Latin Music. He has received numerous Grammy awards for his Latin jazz and classical recordings. A featured performer on Yo-Yo Ma's album, Obrigado Brazil, he performed with Yo-Yo for the opening concerts for the Zankel Hall at Carnegie Hall in September 2003.

While Paquito's discography includes over 30 solo albums in jazz, bebop and Latin music, he also receives rave reviews for his classical playing, including solo performances with the National Symphony Orchestra, Brooklyn Philharmonic, London Royal Symphony, Florida Philharmonic Orchestra, and St. Luke's Chamber Orchestra. Paquito also tours world-wide with his Chamber Jazz Ensemble, Big Band and Quintet.

Mr. D'Rivera has rapidly gained a reputation as an accomplished composer, revealing his versatility and widespread influences. He has been commissioned by the Turtle Island and Ying String Quartets, New Jersey Chamber Music Society, International Double Reed

Society, Library of Congress, and Jazz at Lincoln Center.

His Gran Danzon for flute and orchestra was premiered in 2002 by flutist Marina Piccinini with Leonard Slatkin and the National Symphony at the Kennedy Center. "Best that night was Paquito D'Rivera's Gran Danzon...a spiky and imaginatively colored piece...a dazzling work revealing D'Rivera's sophistication as a composer." Washington Post

### JUSTINIAN TAMUSUZA

One of Africa's leading composers (b. 1951, Kibisi, Uganda), Tamusuza has written music for Western classical musicians incorporating traditional African folk elements, minimalist techniques, pentatonic scales, percussionism and poly-rhythms.

"My early training was not at all formal...The music I practiced was Kiganda traditional music: singing, playing drums and tube-fiddle, endingidi. My father used to brew local beer, and local musicians gathered

at our home playing traditional music while taking the beer, so as a child I was attracted to their music and practiced with them. My childhood was also influenced by the music making at traditional rituals such as twin-rites, last funeral rites and weddings."

Also an organist, Dr. Tamusuza received his formal training in composition at Makerere University (Uganda), and at Queen's University of Belfast on a British Commonwealth Scholarship. He received a Fulbright Award to serve as a visiting professor to Northwestern University in the USA, where he received his doctoral degree in 1993.

The Kronos Quartet best-selling recording of his string quartet Mu Kkubo Ery' Omusaalaba from their album "Pieces of Africa" made history when it hit the top of both of Billboard's Classical and World Music categories. Dr. Tamusuza has served on the Music Jury of the International Society of Contemporary Music and was the Artistic Director of the africa95 Contemporary African Composers Workshop in the United Kingdom hosted by the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic. He is currently Chairman of the Department of Music, Dance and Drama at Makerere University in Kampala, Uganda.

### WILLIAM GRANT STILL

#### SOONG FU-YUAN

Soong Fu-Yuan was born in Nanjing, China. From childhood he studied piano with his mother, Leng Lan Qin, and started composing as a child. His twin loves were Chinese poetry and Western classical music. At the age of 18 he moved to America to study composition and though Soong composed many piano, chamber, orchestral and operatic works, his music could not find an outlet since he refused to adhere to the new styles of serialism and the avant-garde that dominated the American new music scene.



Soong's chamber music has received performances by ensembles from the Chicago Symphony and the New York Philharmonic. In 1983-84 his play with music, Tao Yuan, was presented by the Bel Canto Opera in New York City and received a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts. A 1990 CD of Soong's Poems for Piano by Tchaikovsky Competition Laureate pianist Paul Rutman received quick acceptance and praise.

In 1992 Soong composed music for The Little Fox which has been performed many times since. In 1994 musicians from Canada, China and the U.S. performed his music in a concert at the Terrace Theatre of the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C. In 1995, he was invited, along with four other Chinese-American musicians, to give concerts in Beijing and Shanghai, broadcast nationally by China's Central TV. In addition, he was invited to lecture and participate in discussions about new music in the composition departments of the Central Conservatory in Beijing and the Shanghai Conservatory. Beijing's TVAC, issued three CD's of Soong's music in 1996: Poems for String Quartet, The Little Fox, and a reissue of Poems for Piano.

The year 2002 saw the New York premieres of his Three Poems by the New York Chamber Symphony, Gerard Schwarz conducting, and his opera Return to Paradise (about the September 11th tragedy).



### GAMAL ABDEL-RAHIM

Gamal Abdel-Rahim (1924 - 1988) was born into a musical family. His father registered the invention of a Boehm flute that was capable of playing the three-quarter tones that are found in characteristic Arabic modes (maqam, maqamat = plural)

In 1950 he studied at the Musikhochschule of Heidelberg where he firmly decided that creative musical composition was to be his vocation. He joined the Musikhochschule of Freiburg where he studied composition with Harald Genzmer, a well-known pupil of Hindemith.

Gamal returned to a changing Egyptian society after the 1952 revolution which ended the British



When the Cairo Conservatory of Music first opened in 1959, Gamal was appointed to teach theory and harmony and was later appointed head of the composition department which was started in 1971, the first of its kind in the Arab world. He created his own multicultural compositional style that fused Arabic and Western music and earned him the title of "Bartok of Egypt." He held this position until 1984, later traveling to the United States in 1987 to teach for two years at the University of South Florida at Tampa.

#### ABDO DAGHER

عيده داغر

Abdo Dagher was born in Damietta, Egypt in 1936. Abdo taught himself to play the oud (Arabic lute) when he was seven and a performance by a foreign soloist (possibly David Oistrakh) attracted him to the violin when he was ten. He left home at the age of thirteen and had to earn his living by working as a musician. The greatest impact on Abdo Dagher's knowledge and musical compositions goes back to the religious music performed by the Sufi orders, which he learned in his childhood. Abdo Dagher's instrumental compositions were inspired by religious hymns and Koranic chanting.

Abdo Dagher moved to Cairo when he was 18 and worked in a shop manufacturing musical instruments. As his virtuosity became well known, he was taken up as a member of famous Arabic orchestras like that accompanying Um

Kulthum, the most well known singer in Egypt and the Arab world in the 20th century. In 1992 he started presenting his compositions in concerts of his music outside Egypt including Germany, Austria, Switzerland, Netherlands, France, Italy, Bulgaria and Qatar, and held workshops on Arabic violin playing. Known as Malik At-Taqasim (Master of Improvisation), Abdo Dagher has a wealth of music in his repertoire but he does not read or write notated music. He recorded with the two most famous musicians of 20th century Egypt, Um Kulthum and Mohammed Abdel-Wahab. After speaking on the radio in regard to his idea of founding a firqa (Arabic Music Ensemble) to revive Arabic musical heritage, he received funding from the Egyptian Ministry of Culture.


